PopUK PSHE Workshop

Elm and Oak classes will be taking part in a day of PSHE activities on Wednesday 26th January. The project entitled, 'Will you 'like' me?' looks at the online world and the ways in which it impacts on our children, and their families. Recently, the Children's Commissioner highlighted the importance of helping our children learn about these issues and we believe this is a key aspect of life and growing up in our community today. 'Music Plus Trust' is an educational charity directed by Andy Silver founder of the 'PopUK' project, which empowers children with messages about key life skills and values that are important in modern life.

During the day, all the children will learn 3 songs, teaching them about the online world and technology and its effect on their emotions and wellbeing. There is no cost for this workshop as the Thomas Rudge have kindly offered to pay for both classes to take part.

Extra Bank Holiday

For your information, due to the Queen's Platinum Jubilee an additional Bank Holiday has been given in 2022. As this falls within the May half-term, schools have been allowed an extra days holiday during term time. We will be adding the bank holiday onto the May half-term and the school will be closed to both staff and children on **Monday 6th June 2022**.

Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

This change came into effect in England on Monday 17 January and applies to all positive cases, regardless of vaccination status.

People who are self-isolating with COVID-19 have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with an LFD test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be [reported to NHS Test and Trace](#).

If the result of either test is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.

I am excited at the prospect of school hopefully returning to a more normal way of life as this term progresses and look forward to welcoming everyone back into school as soon as possible.
