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## Healthy Snacks and Water

All children should have a named water bottle in school every day. The Children are only allowed to have water in their bottles. They may bring a small carton of juice to drink with their lunch but are not allowed squash or juice in their water bottles. The children in KS2 may also bring a snack to eat at playtime (please note that the children in EYFS and KS1 are given a fruit/vegetable snack each day). A healthy snack is either a piece of fruit, some raw vegetables, buttered crackers, plain breadsticks or toast.

## No Nuts

Please do not give your child any food items that contain nuts. This includes snacks or as a part of their packed lunch. Please be aware that we have children in school with nut allergies and we therefore need to minimise the risk for these children. Under no circumstances send your child into school with peanut butter, Nutella or cereal bars or biscuits containing nuts.

## Parking

Please do not use the parking spaces at the front of the school as this prevents a member of staff from being able to park close to school. Please use the carpark at the end of the orchard or the carpark next to the village hall when dropping off or collecting your child from school or when attending events at school or the church.

## Wrap Around Provision

We offer before and after school club provision from 7.45am until 5.30pm. If you wish for your child to attend either breakfast or after school club we ask that you book their place by calling or emailing the school office. There were an increasing number of parents requesting this provision with very little notice. Please ensure that you have booked your child's place at least two days in advance unless you encounter an emergency.
