Expectations of Uniform and Dress

At All Saints' we hold the highest standards of uniform expectations. We are proud that children are smartly dressed and take pride in their appearance, which in turn upholds the school's reputation.

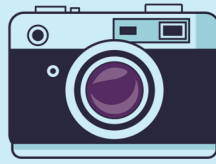
During recent weeks, I have noted a small but increasing number of pupils arriving in trainers to school, which aren't part of school uniform. I have an appreciation for two factors - that during the pandemic uniform suppliers have been closed and also parents not wanting to spend money if their child has outgrown shoes so late in the term. Whilst I take a common sense approach at this point in time, I would urge parents to make sure children have the correct shoes and uniform for September.

In terms of hair, we ask pupils with long hair to wear a bobble to tie hair away from their face. We ask that lines and patterns are not a part of shorter hairstyles.

Jewellery should not be worn to school in the form of rings, bracelets, necklaces or earrings. These are a particular safety concern if they are caught whilst children are playing.
